I live in an apartment in South-Central Austin, nearby a good school district and within walking distance to beautiful parks and nature trails. My home is cared for with love.








My Work



It has always been my priority to spend time with my niece and nephews and make memories. My child will have every opportunity to explore and celebrate big and small moments with family.




















WHAT WOULD YOU SAY ...


